

# The Amusement Park 'Zieleniewo'



The Amusement Park 'Zieleniewo' is located in Zieleniewo near Kołobrzeg. The main car park is located at 68 Szczecińska Street, and an additional one at 9 Wycieczkowa Street. You get there by bus from the train station.

The Amusement Park 'Zieleniewo's offer includes:

- \* The Lunapark (a funfair) - including a rifle range, a trampoline, a pile of logs formed in a high climbing wall.
- \* The Mini Zoo (including peacocks, camels, ostriches, emu, monkeys and others), the opportunity of camel-, horse- and pony-riding.
- \* The Indian village - the possibility to shoot with a bow, to dance along with the Indians, taste the delicacies straight from the wigwam.
- \* The Western City (a cowboy Wild West-like street) - gunslingers duels, bank robberies and many other attractions take place there.
- \* The Horse stables - horse riding lessons (the

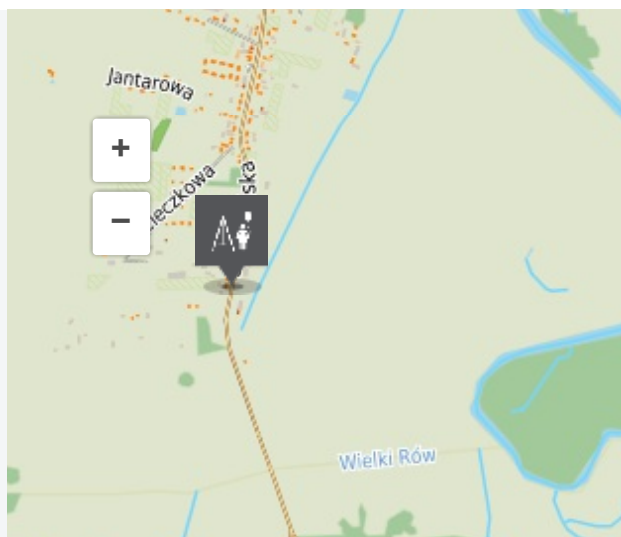
