The museum has its seat in the centre of Trzęsacz at 3B Klifowa Street, 50 metres from the ruins of St Nicholas's Church and a five-minute walk from the Seaside Narrow Gauge Railway Gryfice - Trzęsacz - Rewal - Niechorze - Pogorzelica.

The museum was established in 2000. Its founder was Władysław Jagiełło, a resident of Trzęsacz between 1998 and 2006. The exhibition depicts the history of Trzęsacz, especially St Nicholas's Church and the 15th meridian, on which the town is located. The respective rooms show the history, legends, the abrasion process, the meaning of the 15th meridian, time zones, how life looked like in Trzęsacz 600 years ago. The exhibition is enriched by films, sound effects, projections of the
